**Chairman's Report** – James Morgan

Chairman Morgan moves to appoint David Clapp as a member of the Planning Board for a term to expire March 31, 2022, seconded by Councilor Bourdon

The Derry Town Council has already pledged \$45,000 for repairs at the Derry Opera House. It is requested by Chairman Morgan to add an agenda item for a June Town Council meeting to discuss funding the remaining \$75,000 needed.

There is a Town Council goals workshop scheduled for June 22 at the Derry Opera house. The Town Council meetings in July and August will be on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesdays.

Town Administrator's Report - David Caron

The base pavement on the rail trail has been applied and the fencing along the dam is currently being installed. Regarding Exit 4A, SB116 requires NHDOT to complete the project within the timeframe of the Ten-Year Plan; the bill passed the Senate and has a hearing before the House Public Works and Highways on Wednesday. The Governor and Executive Council recently approved a contract award to VHB for final engineering on the project. DPW will report on 5/18 and it appears all activities and events will resume for the 2021 summer season. The Town is still awaiting guidance from the Treasury concerning the \$3.3M due to the Town from the Federal Government. Economic Development is working with local restaurants on a separate aid package directed to the industry. Economic Development is also working with the entertainment venues such as Tupelo and the Greater Derry Arts Council on the federal Shuttered Venues Grant. The House Municpal and County Government Committee has scheduled a hearing on SB87 which would allow use of some water wheeling revenues. The hearing is scheduled for May 17.

**21-45** Resolution #2021-022 – Adoption of the FY 22 – FY 27 Capital Improvements Plan – *Town Administrator Dave Caron presenting* 

Section 9.8 of the Town Charter vests in the Town Council the responsibility to adopt the Capital Improvements Plan by May 31st. The Planning Board has reviewed the plan and proposed no revisions. Pursuant to RSA 674:5, the plan is a budget tool to assist the Town Council in their consideration of the annual budget and the Town Council has reviewed the proposed plan and made any amendments to the plan as proposed by the Town Administrator. 21-53 Resolution #2021-023 –Release a portion of the Captured Assessed Value for the Derry Commerce Corridor Tax Increment Financing District – *Town Administrator Dave Caron presenting* 

RSA 162-K:10 II (b) requires that any excess Captured Assessed Value(CAV) shall be deemed excess CAV and returned to the tax lists (i.e. available for use by the Town, County and School District). There are no provisions under state statutes which allow for the original assessed value identified at the time a District is formed to be adjusted as a result of subsequent property revaluation, thus all of this new value becomes part of the CAV. As a result of the 2020 property revaluation, approximately \$47M in new value was identified. Based upon staff analysis, it is recommended that \$45M in value be returned to the tax lists. This is the same amount when the Council was reviewing the Town's financial status during collective bargaining negotiations. During those discussions, the Council concurred to returning the \$45M in value to the tax lists,

and allocation 2/3 of the taxes generated to the collective bargaining process. This Resolution completes that process.

**21-54** Resolution #2021-027 – Accept additional Wellness Grant Funding from Health Trust – Wellness Coordinator Elizabeth Robidoux presenting

The Town of Derry continues to participate in HealthTrust's Wellness Coordinator Program. This year, HealthTrust awarded a Wellness Coordinator Stretch Goal bonus in the amount of \$250.00. This is in addition to the \$1,000.00 received in January which is the annual grant. The Town surpassed its stretch goal by beating a 2 year average for Biometric Screening participation and Slice of Life enrollees. There was also a 2% increase in the number of employees who created secure enrollee portals and participated in SmartShopper. The specific use of the HealthTrust award is determined by the Wellness Coordinator(s) and is typically used to fund any expenses of the programs and initiatives. The programs provided by the Wellness Coordinator(s), under the auspices of this grant are available to all employees of the Town of Derry and not just those who are enrolled in the town's insurance program.

# Resolution #2021-023

To Release a Portion of the Captured Assessed Value from the Derry Commerce Corridor Tax Increment Financing (TIF) District

WHEREAS, The Town previously enacted the provisions of Chapter 162-K, Municipal Economic Development and Revitalization Districts; and

WHEREAS, the Town established and actively supports its two TIF Districts (Ash Street and Derry Commerce Corridor) by investing in their development for the benefit of the Districts and the entire community; and,

WHEREAS, RSA 162-K allows the Captured Assessed Value to be retained to fund infrastructure, operating and debt service costs associated with the TIF District; and

WHEREAS, RSA 162-K requires that the Town return Excess Captured Assessed Value to the general tax base to help defray town, school and county expenses; and

WHEREAS, the Town has successfully developed the Derry Commerce Corridor TIF District whereby Excess Captured Assessed Value is now available to be returned to the tax lists;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED IN COUNCIL that Excess Captured Assessed Value from the Derry Commerce Corridor Tax Increment Financing District in the amount of \$45.0 Million be returned to the tax lists to help defray Town, School and County expenses.
