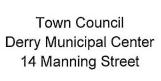

#### Chair Report - Joshua Bourdon

Paul Lindemann gave a Historic Preservation Update for the Meetinghouse at First Parish. Congratulated MaryAnn Connors-Krikorian on her retirement. Councilor Foote read a proclamation at the last school board meeting. Thanked Deputy Chief Feole for the dedication ceremony of the Police Station in honor of Chief Edward Garone.

#### **Town Administrator's Report** – Dave Caron

Pursuant to the Council's action in July 2009 which delegated detail rate setting authority to the Town Administrator, the Council is hereby notified that the rates have been adjusted to reflect the Town's personnel costs, effective July 1, 2022, as follows: Police Detail Rate - \$80.00/hour; Police Cruiser Detail Rate \$18.75/hour; and Fire Detail Rate \$83.00/hour. As the town

approaches fiscal year end, most of the revenue estimates will be met or exceeded. Staff will present several Resolutions at the Council's August 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting to finalize budget transfers and other FY22 year-end transactions.

### **Public Hearings**

22-75 Resolution #2022-046 – Enter into an Intermunicipal Agreement with the Town of Chester for police prosecutorial services and to provide a Supplemental Appropriation thereto – *Deputy Police Chief George Feole* 

As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic restrictions being lifted in the State Court's system, the police department's workload in prosecution has increased significantly. The two prosecutors find that they cannot keep up with the workload during their normal schedules. Both of the prosecutors are working 10-15 hours extra each week as a result. The creation of this position would ease the additional 20-30 hours a week they are subjected to, as a result of this increase in case load. Also, recently the Town of Chester has expressed an interest in the Town of Derry Police Prosecution assuming the prosecutorial functions of the Chester Police Department. It is estimated that 5 hours per week would be dedicated to Chester prosecution services with an initial revenue rate from the Town of Chester of \$26,000, pro-rated based on actual contract start time. The contract has an annual escalator of 3%, subject to mutual agreement for these services. If approved, it is anticipated that a part-time prosecutor would start on or about September 1, 2022, and work 20 hours per week dedicated to the Town of Derry and an additional 5 hours per week dedicated to the services for the Town of Chester for a total of 25 hours per week. The Police Department Budget for FY 23, as approved in May, did not consider an additional part time prosecutor or the revenue stream associated with executing a contract for prosecution services with the Town of Chester. Section 9.6 of the Town Charter provides the ability for a 2/3 majority of the Council to make a supplemental appropriation. We are requesting that the Town Council appropriate an amount equal to the revenue so as to not impact the tax rate. Expenditures for the new position beyond the revenue amount will be made from funds already approved by the Town Council in the FY 23 budget. The pro-rated revenue is anticipated to be \$21,667.

#### **New Business**

**22-80** Resolution #2022-048 – Adopt the Town's Emergency Operations Plan – *Fire Chief Jim Richardson* 

Emergency Management Staff in collaboration with all other Town Departments has completed the review and redrafting of the Town of Derry Emergency Operations Plan. The purpose of this plan is to facilitate the delivery of all types of emergency response and to help deal with the consequences of significant disasters. The Emergency Operations Plan outlines the planning assumptions, policies, concept of operations, organizational structures and specific assignments of responsibility to the Town Departments and agencies involved in coordinating the local, state and federal response activities. For security purposes the complete Emergency Operations Plan is distributed to select Town Officials and is not publicly available.

22-81 Resolution #2022-049 – Apply for, Accept and Expend a Homeland Security Grant for Continuity of Operations Planning – *Fire Chief Jim Richardson* In 2019, the Derry Bureau of Emergency Management identified the need to develop contingency plans to maintain essential government functions in the event of a large scale and/or extended duration emergency incident. Specifically, we identified the need to:

- Better prioritize essential functions within the local government and clarify orders of succession to ensure continuity of town leadership and authority;
- Diversify our communication and information systems to ensure we have the ability to effectively communicate with town employees and the public in a timely manner;
- Securely maintain, protect, and access vital public records;
- Better identify and plan for alternate physical and virtual command and control locations during the disruption;
- Develop contingency plans to sustain and support essential employees that are likely to be adversely affected during the incident.

This plan would also provide a template for conducting future training and exercises to ensure the plan remains up-to-date and is "real-world" ready. Currently, the Town does not have a Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP). Although the Town has Emergency Operations plans and proactive Hazard Mitigation plans, maintaining or reconstituting local government operations will be essential to the expedient recovery of the community.

This project consists of two components:

- 1. Completion of the Town of Derry Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP)
- 2. The establishment of an alternative communications system for notifying and informing staff during continuity of operations incidents.

The purpose of this plan is to provide continuity of government procedures, information and assignments of responsibility applicable to planning, preparation, mitigation, response, and recovery operations related to an incident disrupting municipal operations with the Town of Derry.

The Town's Finance department with guidance from the town auditors, Melanson, has completed the drafting and review of the Town of Derry Grant Management Policy. The purpose of this policy is to establish and maintain internal controls that provide reasonable assurance that Federal Grant awards are managed in compliance with all Federal regulations and all funds are spent in accordance with any and all terms and conditions of such awards. The guidelines and procedures found in this policy incorporate the Office of Management and Budget's (OMB) Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principals, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards as outlined in the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Title2\_Subpart A\_Chapter II Part\_200 as well as NH RSA 31:95-b-Appropriation for Funds Made Available During the Year. This policy was established to ensure consistency and accountability in securing and managing grant funds by all Town of Derry departments. This policy is subject to amendments based on future OMB directives.
