- 7. Names that were missed on the memorial statue. TJ went to the monument company \$15 per letter to engrave them on the stone. Bronze maple leaf's on the front and attach it to the monument. Hempworth Memorial can do this for us. TJ to get Karen before May 1st. There would be ceremony for the Canadian servicemen and one for the addition of the missing names to re-dedicate the memorials. (November 11, 2018 or Derryfest.)
