## Policy on Tag Days

In accordance with RSA 31:91 the Board of Selectmen hereby adopt the following policy:

Permits for soliciting funds for charitable purposes and for the sale of tags, flowers or other objects for charitable purposes may be granted provided that application is made to the Board indicating the dates for solicitation, nature of the solicitation and purpose(s) for which funds will be used,

In deciding whether or not to issue the permit the Board of Selectmen shall consider the following:

1. Funds should be used to direct benefit to the citizenry of Derry; (except as provided below).
2. No two solicitations efforts shall be conducted on the same dates; dates shall be assigned on a first come, first serve basis.
3. No organization shall conduct more than two solicitations in any calendar year nor shall any organization conduct solicitations for more than three consecutive days; nor shall any organization conduct solicitations for more than four days in any calendar year.

## Additional Provisions

1. National Solicitations - the Board of Selectmen may, at its discretion, issue a permit to a national charitable organization in conjunction with a nation-wide solicitation.
2. Any of the restrictions may be waived when in the opinion of the majority of the Board of Selectmen, special conditions warrant such waiver.
3. The Board of Selectmen will endeavor to so limit the number of solicitations that such limitations will not become a nuisance to the public.
4. The Board of Selectmen may rescind any permit if the organization sponsoring the solicitations does not monitor and control its solicitors activities.
