- Once public safety officers locate the missing person, they can return him or her home safely.

PROVEN TECHNOLOGY

Radio Frequency technology can work in densely wooded areas, buildings and shallow water, even when GPS and cellular technology cannot.

WE WORK DIRECTLY WITH LAW ENFORCEMENT

Law enforcement and other public safety agencies are trained, certified and equipped with SafetyNet Search and Rescue Receivers. In addition, personnel are trained on how to effectively communicate with people who have cognitive conditions.

How it Works:

Person wears a SafetyNet bracelet on either their wrist or ankle which emits a specific radio frequency signal and ID number



When the person goes missing, caregiver notifies 911 immediately and specially trained and equipped SafetyNet personnel from public safety agencies initiate a search using a Digital Tracking Receiver and associated antennas

Autism prevalence figures are growing and today it affects 1 in 68 children. It is the fastest-growing developmental disability in the U.S and can cost a family \$60,000 a year on average.

Since 1998 the Flutie Foundation has been supporting families through our programs, partnerships and direct financial support. Throughout our 16-year history, we have awarded more than \$10 million in grants to hundreds of autism organizations throughout New England, New York, New Jersey, Southern California, parts of Florida and Canada. 80% of the funds we raise go directly to helping families.

Annually, the Flutie Foundation distributes more than half a million dollars through its annual grant cycle and programs to organizations that provided the following:

Access to Services: Funding for community organizations and schools who are providing vital resources and actively assisting children with autism spectrum disorder and their families through education and technology, advocacy programs, diagnostic and clinical services, direct family support, safety equipment, respite services and other opportunities that will enhance the quality of life for those affected.

Active Lifestyle: Support for recreational programs, aquatic programs, social skills training, family events and summer camps for all individuals on the autism spectrum.

Adult Community Based Services: Providing opportunities for job training, vocational skills programs, employment, housing, transportation and health care delivery for adults on the autism spectrum.
