The new Transfer Station features several tall doors and loading docks to provide flexibility in operations. Customers and facility equipment are separated from each other on different levels.

Goals for new Transfer Station

- Replace undersized facility built in 1980 when Derry's population was half of today's population.
- Improve traffic flow and reduce excessive waiting time during peak periods.
- Separation of residential traffic from moving equipment.
- Promote increased recycling by additional segregation of recyclable materials.
- Increase revenues by further segregation of materials.
- Promote sustainability through use of LED lighting and an energy efficient building design.
- Promote efficiency through proper design.

What's New

- Residents will be utilizing a new access road located immediately to the right of the scale. This road will bring customers to the new building where they will be able to efficiently dispose of household trash and recyclables.
- Drop-off customers will be asked to segregate materials into separate bunkers by type of material. The materials are:
 - Household Trash
 - Cardboard
 - Mixed Paper
 - #1 Plastics – PETE
 - #2 Plastics – HDPE
 - Steel/Tin Cans
 - Aluminum Cans
 - #3 - #7 Plastics

Three slots for household trash

All household trash will be deposited here. No televisions or hazardous waste allowed.



Mixed Paper and Cardboard

Mixed Paper – Junk Mail, Newspaper, Magazines

Cardboard – Corrugated Cardboard boxes



Plastics Containers and Cans

#1 Plastics – PETE – soft drink and water bottles

#2 Plastics – HDPE – milk jugs and detergents



Plastics Containers and Cans

Aluminum Cans – Soft drinks, beer cans

Steel/Tin Cans – Food packaging



#3-#7 Plastics and Glass

#3-#7 – All other plastics including plastic cups, yogurt containers, salad dressing bottles



#3-#7 Plastics and Glass

Glass- All types of glass including bottles, jars - all colors – NO Light Bulbs

Fee Based Wastes

- See the Scale Attendant (Fees apply) to dispose of the following items:
- Construction & Demolition Debris
- Computers and Television Monitors
- Air Conditioners
- Tires (included in vehicle registration)
- Bulky furniture including Couches and Mattresses
- Follow signage to disposal location after visiting the scale

Other Wastes

- The new Transfer Station will continue to accept the following wastes for no fee:
- Metals
- Yard Waste
- Brush – No contractors
- Propane Tanks
- Batteries
- Waste Oil
- Fluorescent Light Bulbs
